



The UCL aims to contribute now and for the future to improving:

- ♦ Overall health outcomes for the Aboriginal community



SERVICES OFFERED BY THE UNIQUE CENTRE OF LEARNING (UCL)

- *Academic counselling*

- *Application, enrolment & RPL procedures*
